Discussions and decisions at the Orgalime General Assembly in Windsor

Orgalime's summer General Assembly drew industry leaders from across the European engineering community to Windsor, UK in the first week of June. Hosted by our British member associations Beama, Gambica and Eama, the event featured an action-packed programme tackling the hot topics facing the sector today – from Brexit, energy policy and standardisation, to the urgent need for a European industrial strategy.

The public programme was bookended by policy committee meetings and a formal decision-making agenda: we welcomed [new member C.E.F.A.C.D.](#), and Mr. Peter Bongaerts of Dutch member association FME was appointed Chairman of the Orgalime Board of Directors.

A step closer to an ambitious EU industrial policy strategy

Orgalime's efforts to secure industry's place at the core of EU and Member State economic policy are bearing fruit: following a meeting on 29 May, the Competitiveness Council has [called on the Commission](#) to develop and deliver a holistic EU industrial policy strategy.

This move follows hot on the heels of the [joint declaration](#) signed by Orgalime and some 127 other European manufacturing associations. We remain convinced that the time for an ambitious EU industrial strategy is now: if Europe's Industrial Renaissance is to succeed, a joined-up approach will be a must. The Council's Conclusions are a promising step – now, the ball is in the Commission's court.



Industry and research agree: ambitious FP9 is a must

As discussions continue on the shape and direction of the future EU R&D&I Framework Programme (FP9), Orgalime has joined forces with 22 key industrial and research stakeholders to call on European policymakers to develop an ambitious programme that supports EU industrial leadership.

Echoing the priorities set out in our recent [position paper](#), this [joint declaration](#) advocates for an increase in the overall EU R&D&I budget, a well-balanced three-pillar structure, and continued financial incentives in the form of grants for all actors in the value chain.



European engineering - still going strong

Despite the economic and political turbulence of recent years, the engineering sector continues to demonstrate remarkable resilience: the latest figures compiled by Orgalime's economists forecast that output and employment are set to grow again in 2017 – for the fourth year running. Turnover is predicted to break the €2,000 billion mark and the number of jobs directly provided by the industry is expected to exceed 11 million across Europe.
